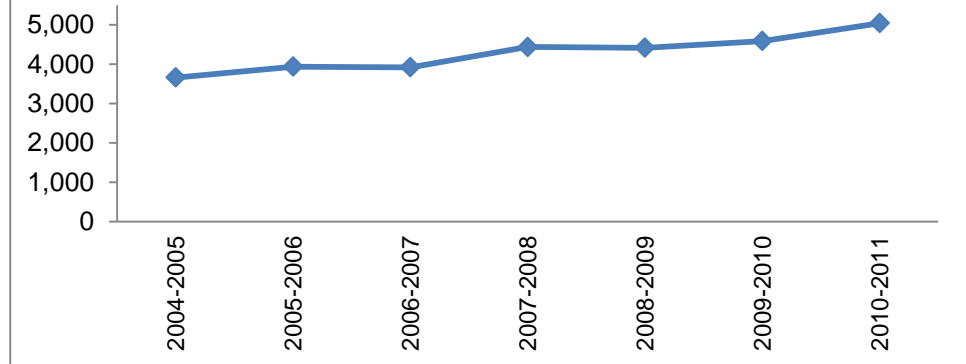

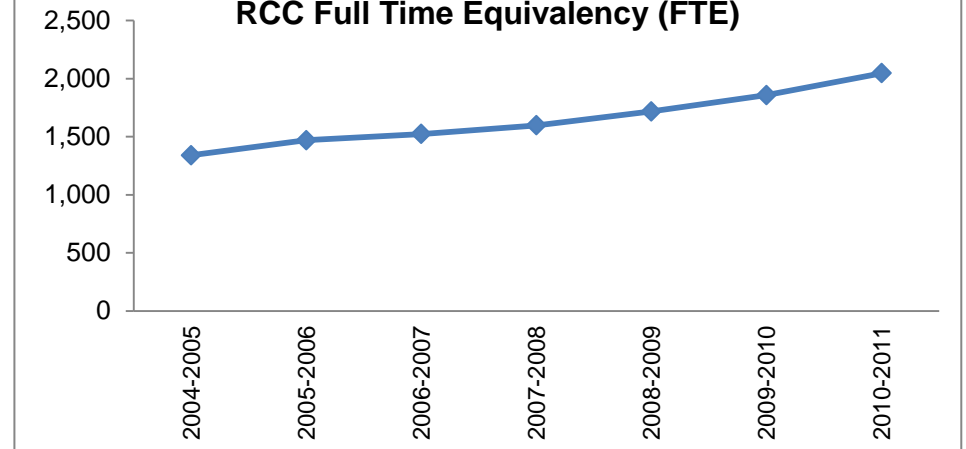

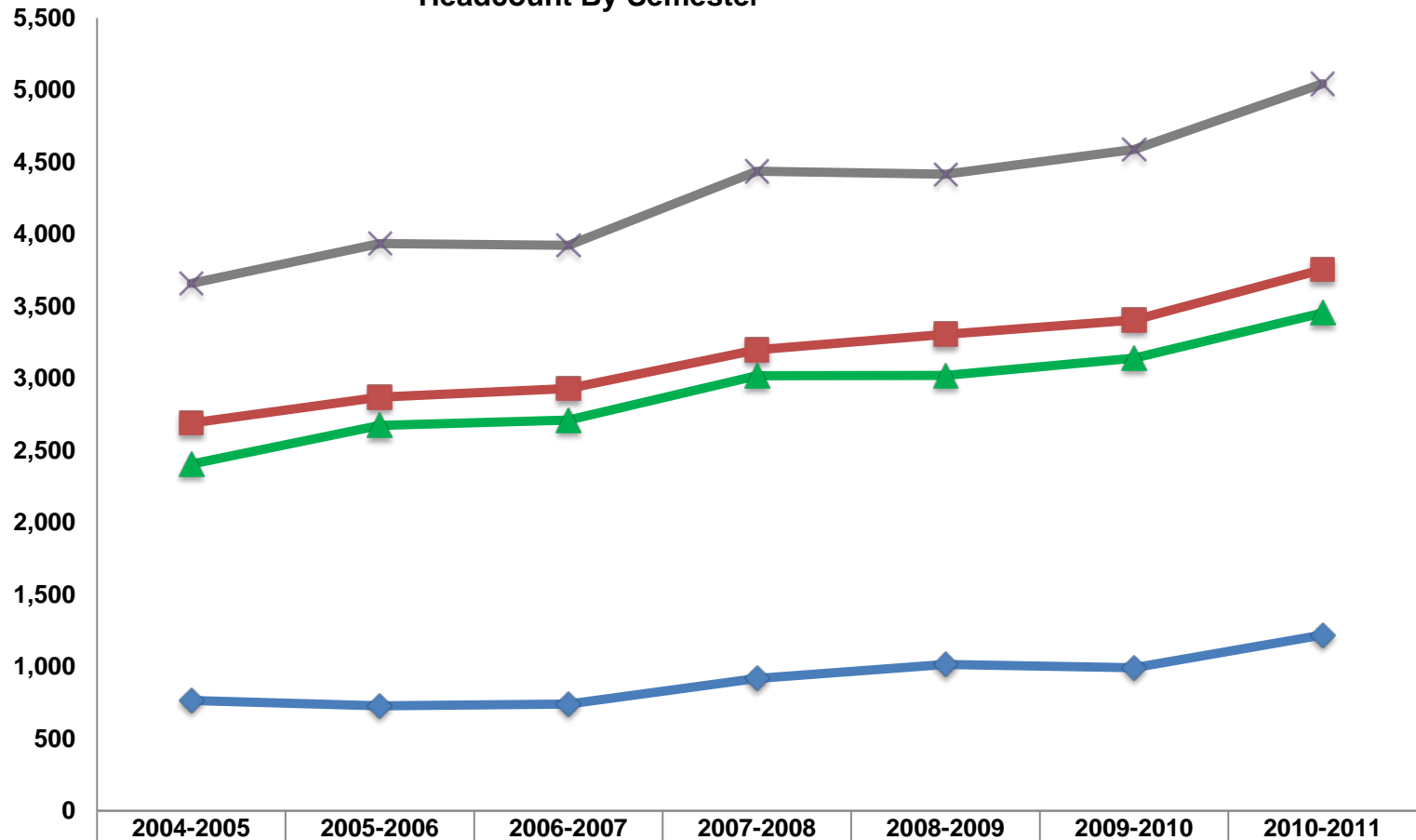

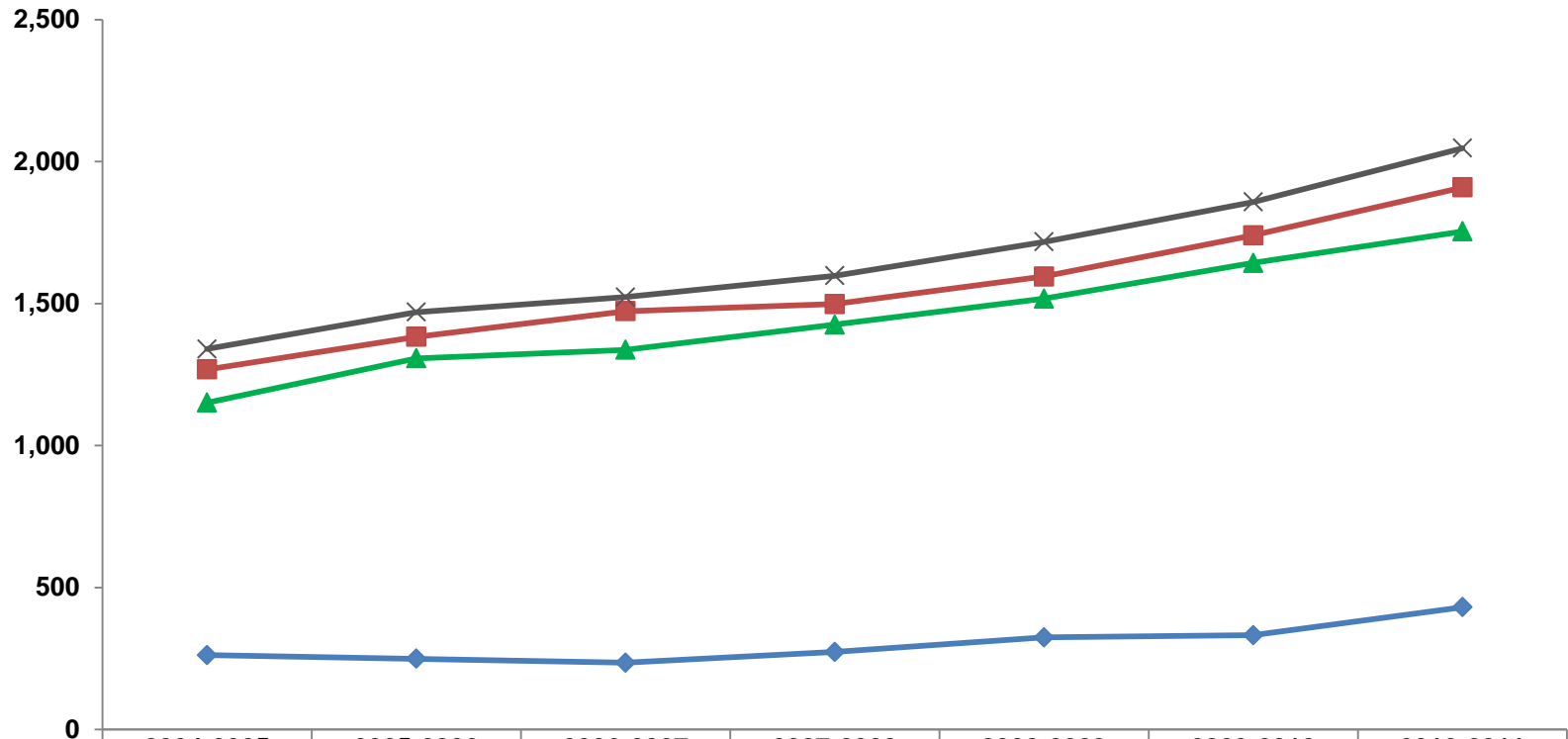

FTE (Full Time Equivalency) by Semester**



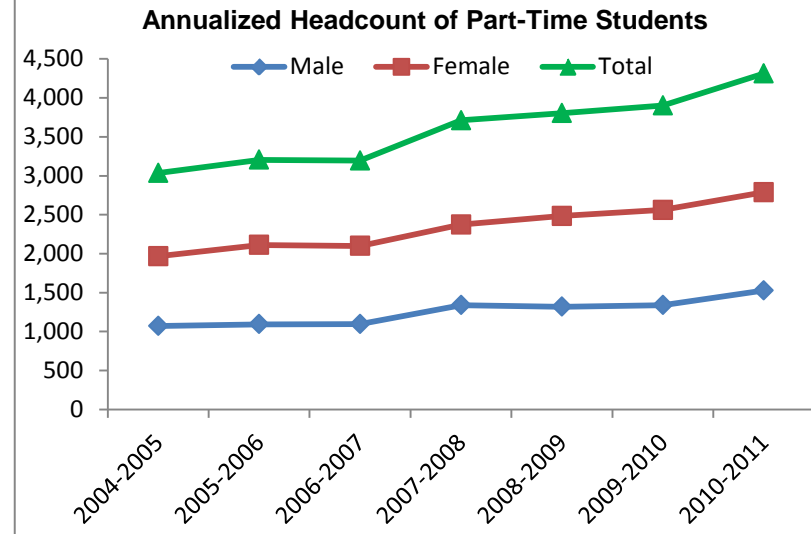
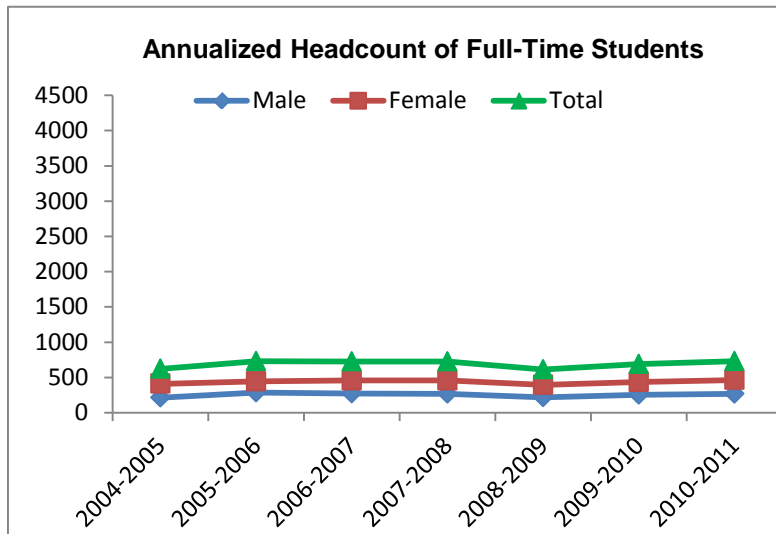

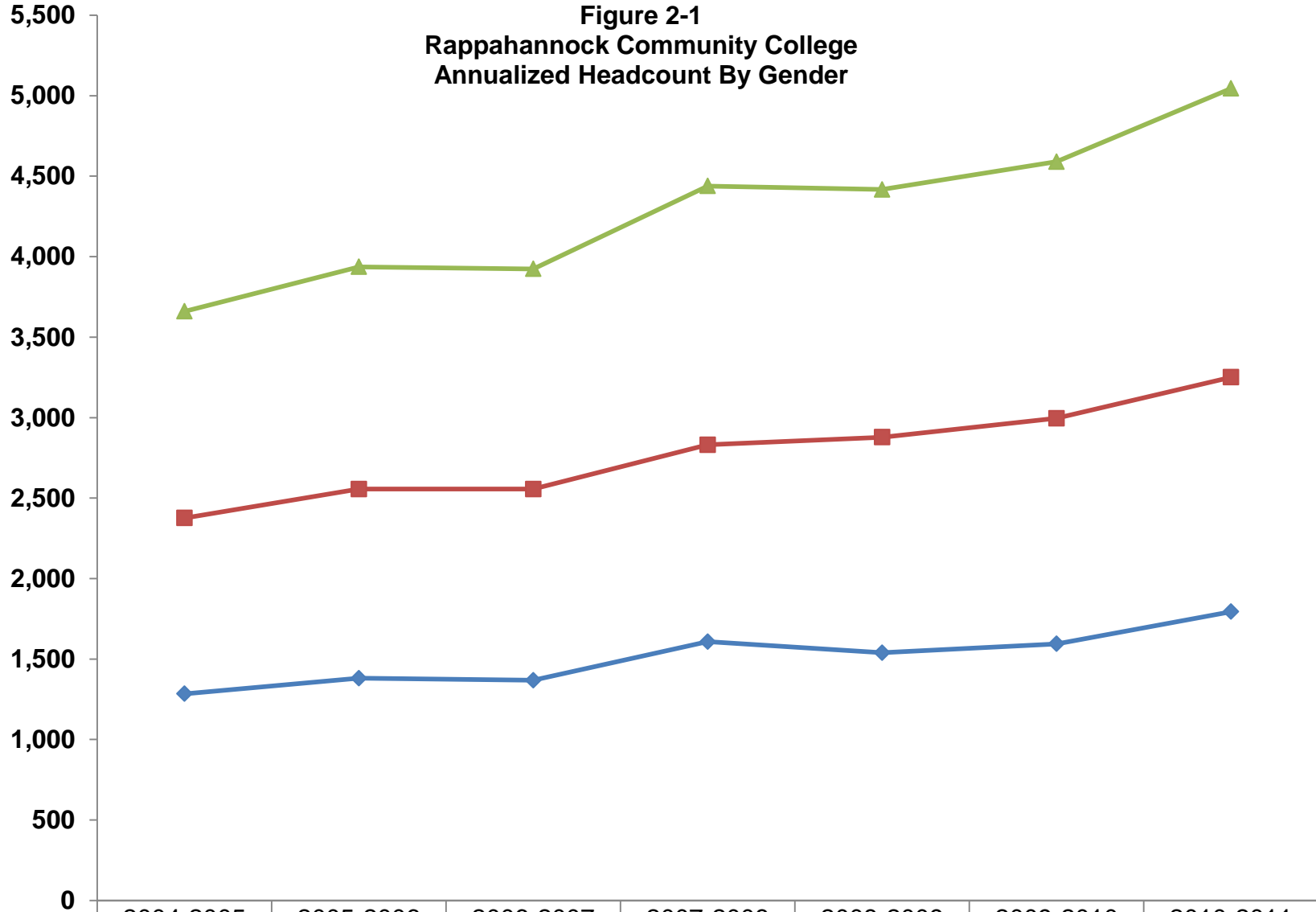

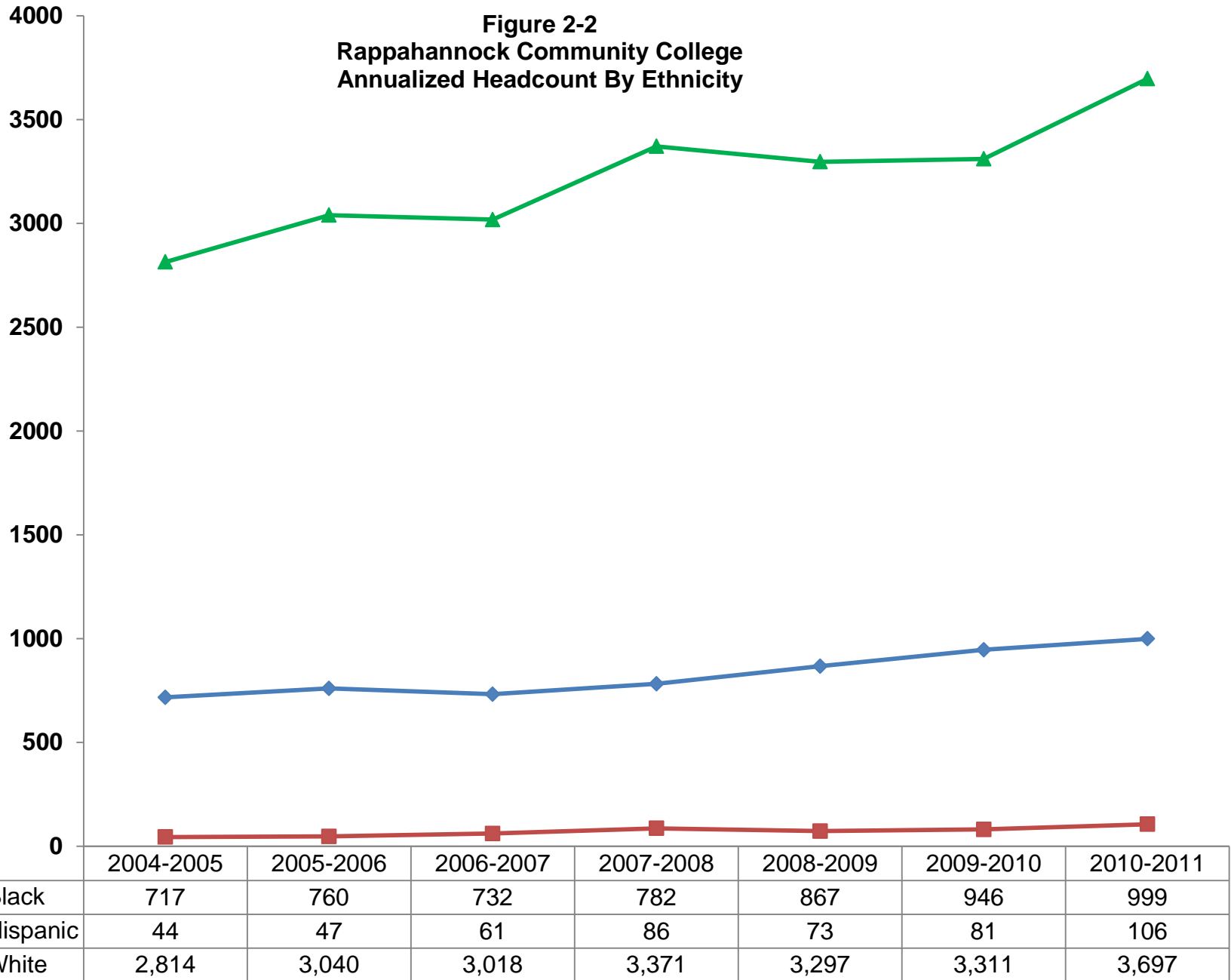

Annualized Headcount By Gender**

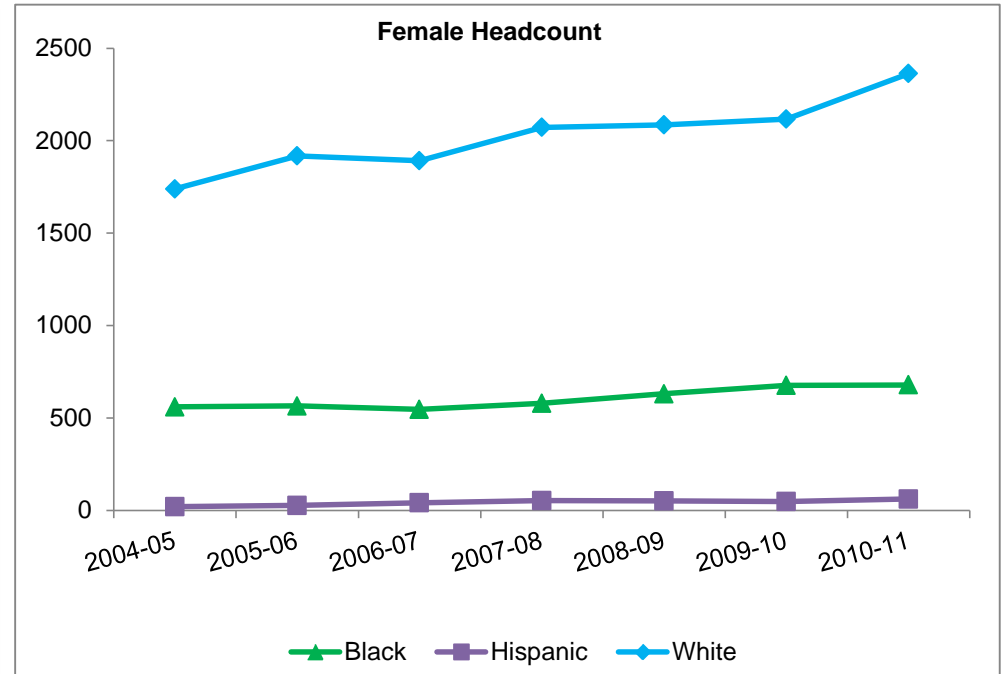
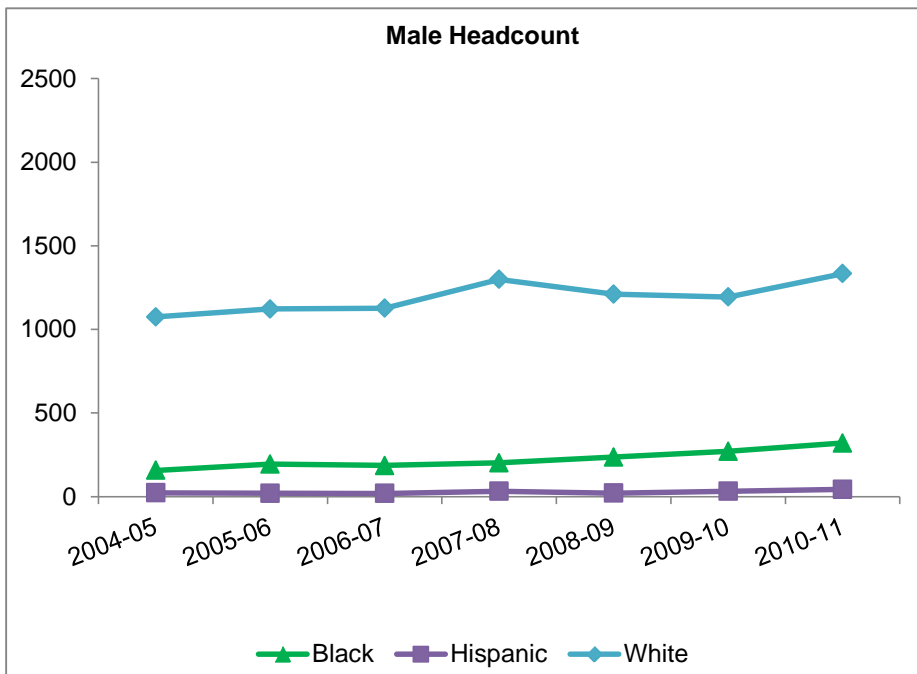


**Figure 2-2
